

## MAINE MENTIONS

Maine, Aug. 17, 1910.

Saturday afternoon, there were several quarrels here, caused by men getting drunk, Mexicans principally, and finally the deputy sheriff had to be called to quiet things. And that evening an accident occurred, just on account of a man working at Saginaw camp being too drunk to get out of the way of No. 3, a quarter of a mile west where this man Joe Valasky had gone to catch an east bound freight on the hill. No. 3 passed at 11:37 p. m. and two freight trains passed east afterward; on the last one Mr. Johnson, a surveyor returning home from Williams, ran across this man lying right up alongside the track. The train had cut his hat brim in front entirely off to the crown. He was conscious still but unable to move as No. 3 had struck him high up in back, breaking his back, which of course paralyzed his lower limbs. Mr. Johnson came to Maine for help, returning with a speeder, and brought the man in just in time to put him on a freight west. Mr. Maynard wiring the company doctor at that point to meet the train. Dr. Melick attended him till the 17th, then sending him to the county hospital at Flagstaff for further attention. This man has relatives in Globe and Phoenix, who have been notified. This is the second man who has been struck by passengers at Maine, while partially drunk, in the past ten days.

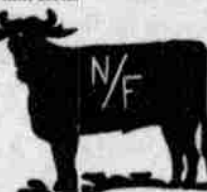

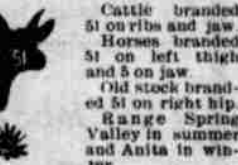

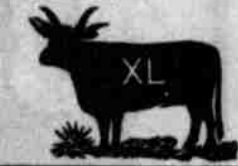
